

Dear Community Partner,

Family & Community Services, Inc. (FCS) has served veterans and their family members since World War II. The agency, incorporated in 1941, developed programming in 1945 to support Portage County's veterans who were struggling to make ends meet. Our roots began with serving those who served our country and is an essential part of what we do.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) estimates that 35,574 veterans are homeless on any given night. Over the course of a year, at least twice that many experience homelessness. Only 7% of the general population can claim veteran status, but nearly 13% of the homeless adult population are veterans. In 2023, homeless veterans increased by 7% from 2022. According to HUD's Annual Homelessness Assessment Report to Congress, this increase is the first time the number of homeless veterans increased since 2019-2020.

Since its inception, in 2020, the Stark County Honor Home campus has had a mix of males and female veterans and families on one property. While the layout of current buildings served the program for some time, it is not well suited for long term operation. With separate VA funding already received, our plan is to build a women's campus a mile away and renovate the existing campus from 16 to 25 beds.

In 2022 FCS received \$1.2 million from the VA to start this renovation. Our plans are to pull the current three-building site into one building for single veterans, offices for staff, and a new community room for programming. The new facility will allow for more staff efficiency and give veterans the space, privacy, and dignity so that they-with our help-can overcome their housing crisis. Thank you for your support of Honor Home and the veterans we have served throughout the years. The agency believes that no veteran should ever be homeless, and with your help, we can make sure we can serve all veterans. 

Community Need

Family & Community Services, Inc (FCS) is leading the charge on housing all veterans who find themselves homeless. The 2023 Annual Homeless Assessment Report in which communities submit homeless counts to be reported through HUD to Congress saw a 7% increase in homeless veterans. Veterans become homeless at a higher rate than their civilian counterparts. Woman veterans continue to make up over 10% of the homeless veteran population compared to only 2% 10 years ago.

The Honor Home-Stark County campus will be unique in that it will have two buildings for woman veterans and woman veterans with children and when renovations are complete one building for veterans of all genders. The buildings will all have staff support 24/7/365. The renovation of the current buildings for single veterans will create individual bedrooms and bathrooms for every single veteran who enters the program. This will make the building more resistant to communicable diseases. It will also increase the capacity from 16 beds for single veterans to 25.

Female veterans are the fastest growing homeless population.

They have grown from just 2% of the homeless population to 8%.





Only around 40% of female veterans receive any benefits from The Department of Veterans Affairs paints a bleak picture of our Country serving all veterans.

With your support, we can make sure that all of Stark County's veterans who are homeless can be served. We will be able to transform Honor Home from veterans sharing congregate bedrooms and bathrooms to space that provides the privacy, dignity, respect that our veterans deserve as they work through their housing crisis.



Our Services

A Home Away from Home

At Honor Home, our facility is truly a stepping stone to veterans reaching their housing goals. With a large kitchen, dining room, meeting rooms and private outdoor areas—residents can tend to their daily needs and start to get their lives back on track in a comfortable and welcoming environment. After renovations are made, each veteran will also have their own private bedroom/bathroom suite. Staff are available on-site 24/7 to provide support and resources for those who need it. Veterans also have access to a fully stocked pantry where they can access food, household supplies, and toiletries.

Support Plan

Honor Home offers multiple types of therapeutic groups in which veterans are highly encouraged to attend while receiving services. These groups are conducted by licensed professionals and include psychoeducation, employment integration, creative arts therapy and music therapy.

Access to Other Mainstream Services

As part of the permanent housing plans established with each veteran, they are also informed of other veteran based mainstream benefits that may help them reach their long term

housing goals. Veterans are often engaged with Supportive Services for Veteran Families and/or HUD-VASH in which separate collaborating case managers are available to meet with them on site and help them with their housing search.
